## **DSVS**







#### **Fair**

#### **Members**



#### **Our Goal**


**Noxious Weeds**: Reduce, control and prevent the spread of noxious weeds in the Stillwater River corridor. To truly make an impact and save the Stillwater River watershed from noxious weed invasion, we endeavor to also educate the public.

Water Quality: Improve the quality and supply of water in the Stillwater River Watershed, balancing water needs and availability, both recreationally and agriculturally, through shared sacrifice and water conservation and contamination prevention.

**Forest Health**: Mitigate wildfires by improving the health of our forest while educating landowners about the importance of implementing fire-safe principles and noxious weed control in order to reduce fire risk and protect properties from extensive fire damage.

**Soil Health**: The three aforementioned goals all contribute to the improvement of soil health. Soil health is defined as the continued capacity of soil to function as a vital living ecosystem that sustains plants, animals, and humans. By managing soils, they are sustainable for future generations.

The Stillwater Valley is a wonderful place to live, work, and raise a family. We hope our programs will help enhance the quality of your life. Respect your neighbors' livelihood and property, and be aware that your actions impact your neighbors, human and otherwise. With that being said, the SVWC needs support from all residents and visitors to help preserve this precious ecosystem we call the Stillwater Valley.





#### What We Do

SYC is a Christian organization serving youth third grade through high school in Stillwater County. Programming and supervision is provided by the Director of Ministry, Youth Directors, and Volunteers.

SYC is a safe place to play, socialize, and study in a supportive Christian atmosphere and to hang out with friends and make new friends, too. We have a racquetball court, basketball hoop, pool table, ping-pong table, foosball table, air hockey, video games, cards, board games and a fully stocked snack shop. # Museum of the Beartooths





The museum is honored to house a military exhibit about Stillwater County's own Doolittle Raider, David Thatcher, and Medal of Honor recipient Donald Ruhl. We house an exhibit on the second Crow (Absaroka) Agency that was south of Absarokee. Other exhibits include Stillwater County Schools, mining history, dude ranch history, a tragic murder, plus an outdoor exhibit area that includes a Conestoga wagon, a caboose, and more. Schools within a 100-mile radius visit annually.

The Museum of the Beartooths' mission is to collect, preserve, and share the rich history, art, and culture of the Stillwater County area. As the only museum in Stillwater County, we are operated with grants, donations, and special events. Annually 150+ researchers utilize the archive for genealogy, academic, and professional projects.
